

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
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Believe in Yourself, Nothing is Impossible



A Silent Voice is a 2016 Japanese animated teen drama produced by Kyoto Animation, directed by Naoko Yamada and written by Reiko Yoshida.

This animation is about Ishida Shouya and Shoko Nishimiya, a deaf girl. Both of them are primary school students but Shoko Nishimiya is a new student. She draws Shouya's attention because she is deaf. At first, everyone in the class treats her as a normal person and she also tries to be ordinary. However, as time goes by, her classmates think she is upsetting the class equilibrium and she starts getting bullied. Shouya is the one who bullies her the most and the other classmates either join in or are bystanders. No one is willing to help Nishimiya.

One day, a teacher stops ignoring the problems of bullying in the class. He asks the whole class who bullied Nishimiya. No one raises their hands or admits to it but they all single out Shouya as the culprit. His friends betray him even though they used to bully

Nishimiya. From then on, Shouya becomes the one who gets bullied and ignored. Nishimiya also leaves the school. A few years later, Shouya learns sign language and he meets Nishimiya. He asks her a question with sign language. They slowly become friends and they also meet their primary school classmates.

A Report on Child Poverty

In recent years, child poverty in Hong Kong has become more and more serious. According to the Hong Kong Poverty Situation Report, the child poverty rate is 18 percent which means that about one in five children is living in poverty. What are the reasons behind this phenomenon? What should we do in Hong Kong? This report aims at elaborating on the problems and providing feasible solutions to alleviating child poverty.

First of all, cross-generation poverty is at the root of child poverty. A little while ago, Hong Kong parents set off a craze – asserting that their children should win from the start, but that does not include parents who are poor. Children whose parents are unable to provide sufficient resources for them are living in poverty. Poor children are less competitive when they are competing with children who start leaning when they could barely read or write. There is no way for them to get rid of poverty.

Another effect of child poverty is that it brings inequality of educational opportunities. Traditional elite schools tend to take students who contribute to the school's reputation or development. Therefore, unless children who are living in poverty excel academically, they compete for places with children from wealthier families. But the general situation is that most of the poor children find it difficult to excel like rich children because of insufficient educational resources. As a result, they can only study in ordinary schools, and they

even leave school early because of financial matters. This affects their job opportunities, creating a vicious cycle.

With reference to the above phenomenon, suggestions to eliminate child poverty will be provided: To start with, the best way to alleviate child poverty is through education. Only education can improve their lives. The Education Bureau should allocate adequate resources to nurture students, especially poor students. The government should greatly assist poor students to develop skills beyond schools. Also, it is needed to help students who cannot afford further education to attend other vocational training so that they can develop in other fields.

Additionally, the government should do more to lift the parents of poor children out of poverty. The government needs to work hard to get them into public housing as soon as possible in order to reduce their financial burden. Furthermore, charities can set up foundations to support poor children to develop, study and provide their parents with funds to support their families in a timely manner by a simple application process.


If we can help them in time, those poor children will not remain poor even though their parents are poor. They have the right to a life and chance like other children.

Learning English Through Social Issues - the Amazon Fires

What Happened in Amazon Forest Recently?

The Amazon fires have become a hot topic in the world after the National Aeronautics and Space Administration (NASA) released a series of photos regarding the damages of Amazon this summer. Smoke nearly covered half of the Brazilian territories and eventually spread to the nearby countries, including Peru, Bolivia and Uruguay. Consequently, uncountable species have been affected by the fires and humans are no exception. In particular, they are not isolated incidents in Brazil. More than 74,000 wildfires were recorded this year alone in the Amazon Rainforest, which is an 84 per cent rise from the previous year. Approximately 640 million acres of rainforest has been affected by the fires.

Until now, the public can not reach a consensus on the dominating cause of the fires. Some environmentalists have put the blame on the government policies, which threatened the forest and led to presence of **deforestation**. Some researchers argued that instead of natural factors, human activities, like farming, ranching, mining and drilling, exacerbated the situation and paved the way for the fires. By contrast, the opponents claimed that the fires were resulted from dry season in Brazil and considered it as 'an inevitable and unanticipated accident'.

Nevertheless, both parties agreed that further actions have to be taken to reduce the rate of fires, minimize the influences incurred from these incidents, and more importantly, to prevent these incidents from happening again.

Hints:

Deforestation refers to the clearing of forest areas by cutting down the trees. The contributing factor of deforestation is to make more land available for human uses, namely cattle ranching, farming and urban development.





Why Do the Amazon Fires Matter to Us?

Contrary to the countries surrounding Brazil or some European nations, many people turn a blind eye to this issue as the Amazon areas are far from Hong Kong and hence the influences on us are relatively limited currently. However, as the areas are 'lung of the world', none of us can be free from the impacts of the Amazon fires.

The Amazon Rainforest is the largest rainforest in the world. Some of its functions are to absorb carbon dioxide and slow down **global warming**. Such a massive loss of trees in the Amazon Rainforest make it harder for the Earth to mitigate climate change and eventually we, ourselves, will suffer from it.

Hints:

Global warming refers to the phenomenon of an increase in average temperature of the Earth over time.

What Can We Do to Protect the Earth?

In order to protect and keep our homeland away from such incidents, a lot of things can be done by every one of us.

First of all, as a consumer, we can purchase rainforest – safe products and reduce the use of paper and wood. Also, we can reduce our beef intake because it is known that beef found in processed products and fast-food burgers is often linked to deforestation. While there is less demand, the supply of beef or wood products would be lowered responsibly.

Secondly, as a global citizen, we can support related organizations fighting against deforestation such as donating money and joining their forestry projects.

Last but not least, we should keep an eye on such issues and be aware of the consequences of our actions. Many environmental problems often continue to occur because of lack of awareness and knowledge about them.

Actions speak faster than words. Let's take action now!
